## **OUR GCSE STUDENTS ESCAPE!!**

Year 11 attended a trip to a local Escape Room on Thursday then had lunch in Nandos. This was to mark the end of their GCSE's and celebrate how well they have done. One of our Year 11 students Oliver is going to tell us how his day was:

'The Escape Room was based on World War 2. We had to escape 3 rooms in total where the goal was to turn on a Spitfire plane. The first task was to open the lockers and to get the key to open the locker. We had to put our hands down a grate and use the key to open a puzzle, that revealed another puzzle in a box. We had to find and use a 3 digit code which we got from some medals, belt buckles and buttons which revealed the code. From some pictures on the other side of the room we solved a puzzle using directional locks, the ways the planes were facing opened the box. The final door revealed the final puzzle which turned on the spitfire. We escaped in 59 minutes and 29 seconds with just 31 seconds to spare.'
